We also completed a strategic planning process in 2014. With your continued partnership, I look forward to working together to achieve our ambitious new goal of increasing foundation funding for LGBTQ issues to \$200 million by 2017.







In 2014, Funders for LGBTQ Issues saw increased revenue as we grew in size. More than 80 percent of expenses were directed towards program related


