

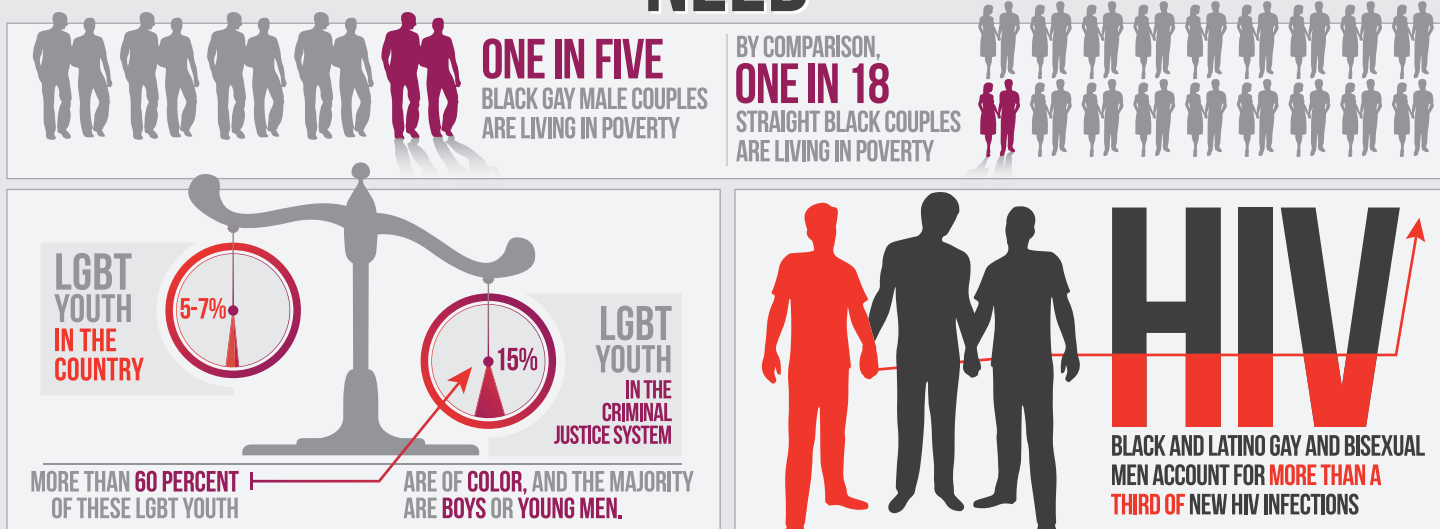

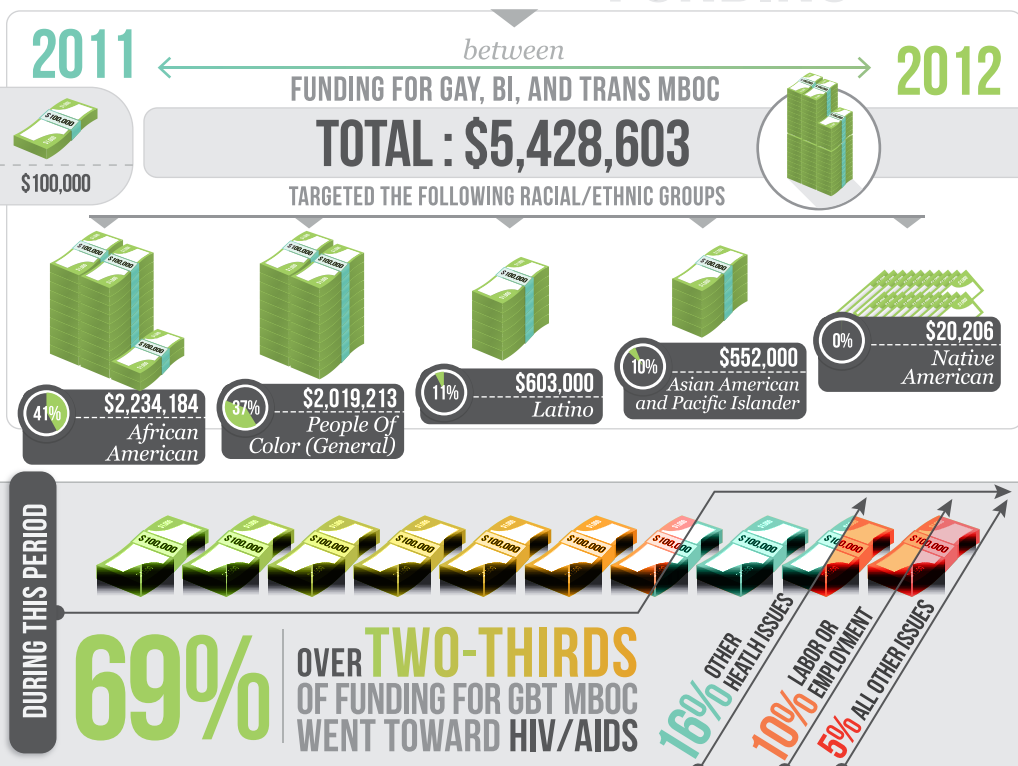

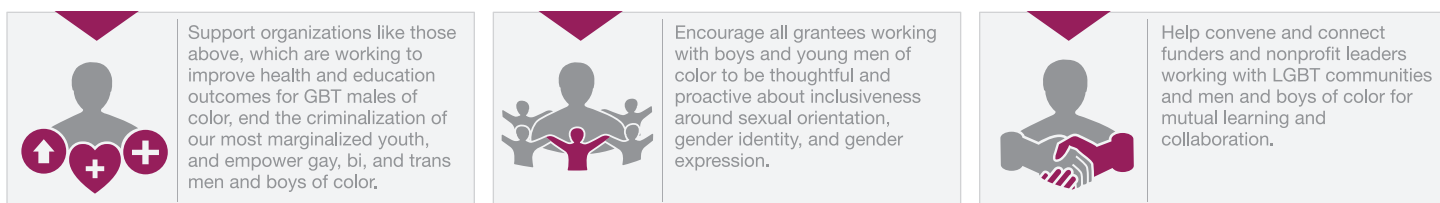
## THE ASSETS

With growing attention on LGBT communities and men and boys of color, funders working with both populations have **opportunities for increased impact** on the unique issues affecting GBT males of color :



## DEFINITION BAR

<b>GENDER EXPRESSION</b>	How a person represents or expresses one's gender identity to others, often through behavior, clothing, hairstyles, voice or body characteristics.
<b>GENDER IDENTITY</b>	An individual's internal sense of being male, female, or something else. Since gender identity is internal, one's gender identity is not necessarily visible to others.
<b>GENDER NON-CONFORMING</b>	A term for individuals whose gender expression is different from societal expectations related to gender.
<b>LGBTQ</b>	Common acronym for <b>Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer</b> people that, despite their differences, are often discriminated against in similar ways. Sometimes written only as LGBT, the "Q" is included to indicate either Questioning and/or Queer. An "I" is also sometimes added for intersex as is an "A" for ally. LGBT may also be written as GLBT.
<b>GBT</b>	Gay, bisexual, transgender, and gender-nonconforming men and boys
<b>MBOC</b>	Common acronym for Men and Boys of Color. This includes African American and Black males, Arab and Middle Eastern men, Asian American/Pacific Islander men, Latinos, and Native American males.
<b>TRANSGENDER</b>	A term for people whose gender identity, expression or behavior is different from those typically associated with their assigned sex at birth. Transgender is a broad term and is good for non-transgender people to use. "Trans" is shorthand for "transgender." (Note: Transgender is correctly used as an adjective, not a noun, thus "transgender people" is appropriate but "transgenders" is often viewed as disrespectful)
